K-State 8 Requirements

- Each student must successfully complete credit bearing course/experiences to cover all of the K-State areas.
- A minimum of four different course prefixes (e.g., AGECE, MATH, FSHS, COMM) must be represented in the fulfillment of the K-State 8 requirements.
- When a course is tagged for two K-State 8 areas, the student may count that course toward both areas.
- Transfer students are also required to cover all K-State 8 areas.
