Unit Leaders Meeting – March 8, 2018

In attendance: Mark Stadtlander, Jason Ellis, Gina Nixon, Rob Nixon, Jason Hackett, Megan Macy, and Patty Karr

Jason Ellis:

- Beginning Monday, March 12, the driveway between Dykstra Hall and Umberger Hall leading to parking lot B13 will be closed. The closures are to protect pedestrians while areas are being excavated to install new electrical components to Umberger. The area is expected to reopen to normal traffic Monday, March 19, weather permitting.
- The construction is part of the Division of Facilities' campus infrastructure improvements. These improvements are planned to eliminate K-State's aging electrical power grid and outdated electrical equipment installed in the 1950s and 1960s. This new electrical system will be a more reliable electrical power source to feed campus buildings. Overall this infrastructure work will take approximately two years to complete and will affect 18 buildings.
- Discussed Project-Based Approach to work assignments and responsibilities.

Gina:

- A total of 43 co-branded 4H and KSU tablecloths were ordered. This dropped the per piece price from \$298 to \$244.
- Wildlife Management ordered vehicle magnetic signs for their trucks. They liked them so well, they ordered more. There was discussion about University Printing's ability to print vinyl car signs for the same cost and the application process.
- The KSRE Bookstore has 500 followers on Twitter. Mandy has the posts planned for March and is beginning to plan April.
- Reminder that the department pays an annual subscription to iStock. Linda Gilmore is the department contact to set up user access to the account. Megan Macy, Jason Hackett, and Mandy Wilson have recently set up accounts.
- Gina will work with Diana Leblanc to schedule a "Mental Health First Aid" class presented by Pawnee Mental Health. This is an 8-hour class, but it can be divided in two 4-hour classes. We need 12 - 25 participants. Cost is \$20 per person, which will be covered by the department. Participants will learn: about the emotional and economical costs of mental illnesses; potential warning signs and risk factors for a variety of disorders; how to help an individual in crisis connect to professional care; and about available resources.
- HRMN meeting on March 21st will be about Mental Wellness at Work. The April meeting is with USI, a risk management and benefit brokerage firm; May will be a Kansas legislative update by Natalie Bright; and in June Frank Keck will present "The 60-Second Coach".
- Jason E., Rob, Mandy, and Gina have started discussions about the next phase of renovation in the basement. They are coming up with a plan, getting estimates, and securing approval of a new fire code footprint. The goal is to create a customer service center where clients can drop-

off and pick up printing, publications, mail, promotion items, etc., an open concept work space, reconfigure production space, add climate control in University Printing, and realign doorways for easier material and equipment delivery. Ultimately, we hope to be able to relocate all printing production into Umberger. The goal is to integrate areas and consolidate space to better serve customers and employees.

- Still working on performance appraisal forms.
- Effective March 8, Deb Stryker will be working from home on Wednesdays. Lori Buss has been out of the office this week. Mandy was out for two days and Lisa was out for one. We will also have reduced staff in both the business office and bookstore March 19-23.

Megan:

- 4-H Policy had a \$100 application licensing fee per year, but there is too much processing time to justify fee for Learfield. It is now changing to a \$200 annual fee. Megan is letting everyone know of the increased fee, and how KSU licensing kept the fee cost down as much as they could.
- She met with Emily Lehning and Ashley Martin on ways KSRE can work with our New Student Services Admissions Reps recruit prospective high school students how communication can work between agents and reps and how we can educate reps about KSRE.
