Jason Ellis:

- Jason will be out of the office on April 11th.
- Jason, Pat and Megan will meet to discuss piloting a different approach to projects using the Culture of Health FCS project. A cross-functional team approach will be used. Other discussion will focus on developing a more focused plan of action, benchmark dates, and metrics.
- Jason will be visiting with Amy Button-Renz concerning a different email system and constant contact.
- Dean Floros will give the State of the College address in April.
- Dean Floros has asked our faculty to consider Associate Dean Zelia Wiley for tenure. She does not currently have a tenure home and our department would make the most sense. Her educational background is in agricultural education.
- First Tuesday Update

 - Budget modernization still in Phase 1, the discovery phase. Phase 2 will be developing a budget model and implementation plan. The model will begin a phased implementation in fiscal year 2020.
